SCHOOL TUITION FEES

School tuition fees cover the provision of full time tuition (25 lessons per week) including English for Speakers of Other. Languages classes (ESOL). Short-stay tuition fee (one term or less) is \$550 per week. Senior students who choose to study the New Zealand NCEA qualification in Years 12 and 13, will pay for the NCEA examination fees separately.

HOMESTAY FEES

The school carefully selects homestay people within our school and local community for our international students. All host adults are police-vetted and follow the Code of Compliance. The homestay fee is \$325 per week.

DISBURSEMENT DEPOSIT

The disbursement deposit is contingency money used to pay accounts incurred by students during the time they are studying at St Hilda's Collegiate School. These accounts may include items such as PE uniform, sports fees and events, orchestral instrument hire, school field trips, daily bus fares (Bee Cards), school stationery, subject fees and New Zealand NCEA qualification examination fees. Additional funds will need to be provided if the student or student's family have requested the school to organise private lessons for music, language or sport tuition.

UNIFORM

Students who are studying at St Hilda's for more than six months will need to buy their full school uniform (approximately \$600). Students who study for only one/two school terms, may choose to hire the uniform from the school (\$300). All students regardless of their length of study are expected to purchase their own shirts (\$45 each).

UNUSED FUNDS

Any funds remaining in the homestay and disbursement deposit accounts of a student will be refunded to the student following the completion of their education with St Hilda's Collegiate School.
